## **Skills Addressed**

· assessing feasibility of, and personal interest in, research topics and ideas

<u>Sι</u>	<u>iggested Uses</u>
V	<b>Independent student use</b> : Ask/ suggest that students read resource on their own and decide for themselves when/ if/ how they will use resource
	<b>Instructor-led Discussion</b> : Devote lecture/ tutorial time to describing the resource, its purposes and uses, and/or incorporate description and use of resource into broader discussion focusing on building the skills the resource targets
	Small Group Discussion: Use to stimulate informal class/ tutorial discussion, and/or small group discussion
Feedback / Evaluation Options	
Y	Personal reflection and/or self-assessment
✓	<b>Informally, in small group discussion</b> : Assign to students to complete for sharing and discussion in small groups
	Peer Evaluation: Assign to students to complete independently, for more formal peer evaluation
	<b>Instructor Evaluation:</b> Assign to students to complete independently or as one stage of a larger assignment, and hand in for formal instructor evaluation
	<b>Tracking Completion without Evaluating:</b> Assign to students to complete resource independently (on an ongoing basis, or at specific, appropriate times during the course), then hand in to instructor to track completion without assigning a specific grade to any individual completed resource
